

Practicing **-dre** verbs and conjugation

Remember—these are the **SUBJECT PRONOUNS**:

je = *I*

tu = *you* (familiar)

il = *he*

elle = *she*

nous = *we*

vous = *you all* OR *you* (formal)

ils = *they* (all guys or mixed group)

elles = *they*

For these, also use "il" verb form

Bob = *(use anyone's name)*

Qui? = *who*

tout le monde = *everyone, everybody*

Assignment for each of the -dre verbs on the list :

attendre, entendre, perdre, rendre, rendre visite à, répondre à, vendre, descendre

You will write the verb (conjugated) three times, and EACH TIME, you must conjugate it for a different set of 3 of the subject pronouns (see above). You may choose which pronouns to use, but vary them from verb to verb. Then, finish it off IN ENGLISH, with something to show the context of the verb.

THEN translate the French part. Here is an example, but using an **-er** verb:

EXAMPLE for ONE verb:

parler : = to speak

je **parle** softly when my little brother is sleeping= *I speak*

nous **parlons** French = *we speak*

ils **parlent** at the movies, and I hate it!= *they talk*

(So, for the next verb, you might use *tu, elle, and vous*... and for the next verb, you might use *je, tout le monde, and elles*, etc.)

- Please number your sets, and start with the infinitive
- Please underline or highlight the subject and verb and the infinitive
- For **rendre visite (à)** & **répondre (à)**.... be sure to put a person's name or a noun for a person, in French... like, *je rends visite à ma cousine* OR *il rend visite au prof de français*.
