

## p.334, Activities 8, 9, 10:

✓ For ALL of these activities, you now must decide whether **QUE** (or **qu'**) *or* **QUI** should be used to connect the clauses.

### •TRANSLATE EVERYTHING•

#### **Activité 8:**

Put together the info to make a sentence that pulls everything together. You're saying that the person IS DOING the first action with the thing because they DID the second action (so... be careful of tenses!) (Notice how this is accomplished in the example they give.)

#### Examples in English:

- *I'm looking at the book **THAT** I bought at Borders.*
- *He's looking for the shoes **THAT** he wore yesterday.*

#### **Activité 9**

These all start with the phrase "**Voici**", which means "**here is**". Your sentences will all be something like:

"Here is the book **THAT I told** you about." •OR•

"Here is the book **THAT tells** about Paris monuments."

NOTE that sometimes you are following your "*that*" with a **subject & verb**, but sometimes just with the **verb**. Therefore, sometimes you'll use **que**, and sometimes you'll use **qui** to connect those clauses.

#### **Activité 10**

Use your imagination to finish off the sentence starters you are given, in French. Careful... think about what needs to come next if you have **que** vs. **qui**.
